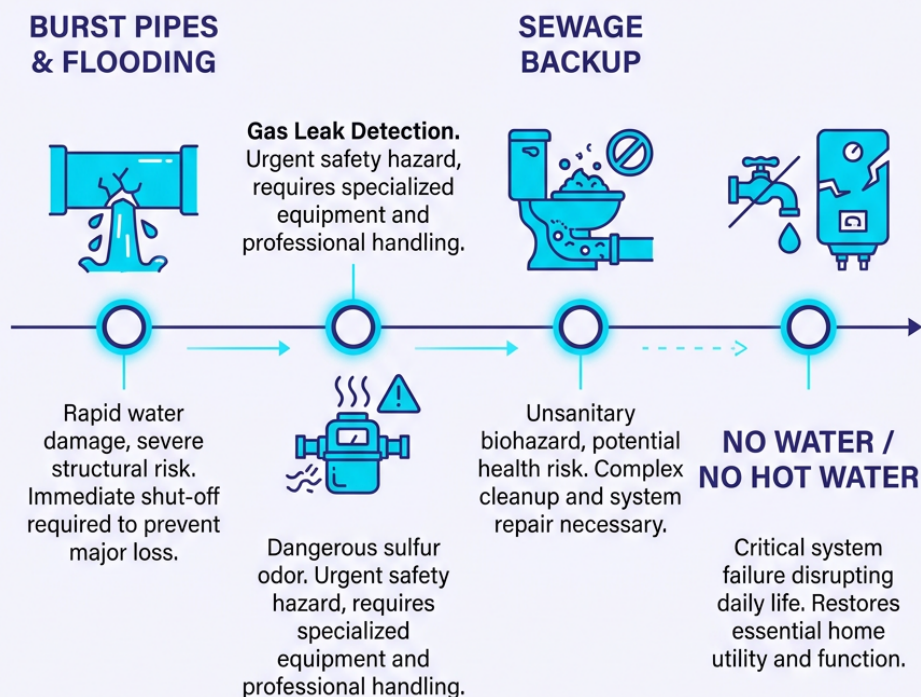
How Does Polybutylene Material Failure Differ from Metal Pipe Breakdown?

Polybutylene was widely installed in the 1980s and early 1990s before manufacturers discovered it degrades when exposed to chlorinated water and UV light. Unlike corroded metal pipes, which narrow gradually, polybutylene fails in unpredictable bursts. The plastic becomes brittle, cracks form without visible leaks, and then catastrophic rupture occurs. Homeowners in the Arts District who still have original polybutylene supply lines live under constant burst exposure. Unlike corrosion, which you might catch with visual inspection, polybutylene degradation happens inside the pipe walls. What Happens When Copper Pipes Develop Pinhole Leaks from Corrosion?

Pinhole leaks start microscopic but multiply over months. A single pinhole becomes five, then a dozen, scattered across multiple joints. You cannot see them until water damage appears on drywall or wood framing. By then, catastrophic loss is already underway. 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How Does Hard Water Accelerate Pipe Material Failure and Burst Risk?

Los Angeles's hard water deposits calcium and magnesium inside pipes, coating the internal walls with mineral buildup. This layer insulates corroding metal from oxygen temporarily, but it also narrows the internal diameter, raising water pressure and stress on the pipe walls. Over time, the mineral coating flakes off, exposing fresh metal to corrosion. This cycle repeats, weakening the pipe from the inside while the outside appears fine. Burst exposure climbs as the wall thickness decreases. The corrosion liability is highest in galvanized-steel lines over 40

years old because the zinc coating has already failed, leaving nothing to slow the process. Hard water turns a slow material-failure problem into a rapid one.
