2. **Customer Seed:** The gamer's web browser generates another random string (or allows the user to input their own).
3. **The Roll/Outcome:** When combined, the server seed, customer seed, and a nonce (a counter) produce the outcome.
4. **Verification:** After the round concludes, the unhashed server seed is exposed. The gamer can input these variables into a verification tool to guarantee your house did not manipulate the roll.

Dangers Associated with CSGO Gambling
