Winter lingers in Gretna, then spring arrives quickly. When forsythia bloom in town and soil temperatures succeed in roughly the low 50s, crabgrass starts off to stir. Kentucky bluegrass in sunny spots along Highway 6 can take a dash extra than a shady outside in Remington Ridge. Shade variations the whole thing. In low faded, blades stretch and skinny. Feed aggressively in spring and also you get leggy, infirmity-susceptible improvement. If your lawn has quite a lot of color from mature timber close to the Gretna Sports Complex side, reduce spring nitrogen to a third of a pound and concentration on mowing height and leaf cleanup.
