Prices change continuously; they reflect typical Steam Community Market listings at the time of writing.

Aspects That Influence Rarity

1. **Drop Rate**-- The possibility of a case appearing as a random drop is incredibly low for some older cases. For example, the Operation Bravo Case drops are roughly 0.15% compared with 1-- 2% for modern-day cases.
2. **Occasion Duration**-- Cases tied to limited-time operations (e.g., Bravo, Shattered Web) stop to be granted once the operation ends. This produces a tough supply ceiling.
3. **Promotion Type**-- Some cases were just distributed through purchase of specific "Starter Packs" or as benefits for participation in competitions. These promotion-only cases can be more elusive than basic drop-only boxes.
4. **Skin Popularity**-- The presence of extremely desirable "Covert" or "Classified" skins inflates demand. The AK-47 Fire Serpent, for example, makes the Operation Bravo Case especially important.
5. **Age and Nostalgia**-- Early CS: GO cases carry historic significance, interesting veterans and collectors who missed the initial release windows.

How Collectors Acquire Rare Cases

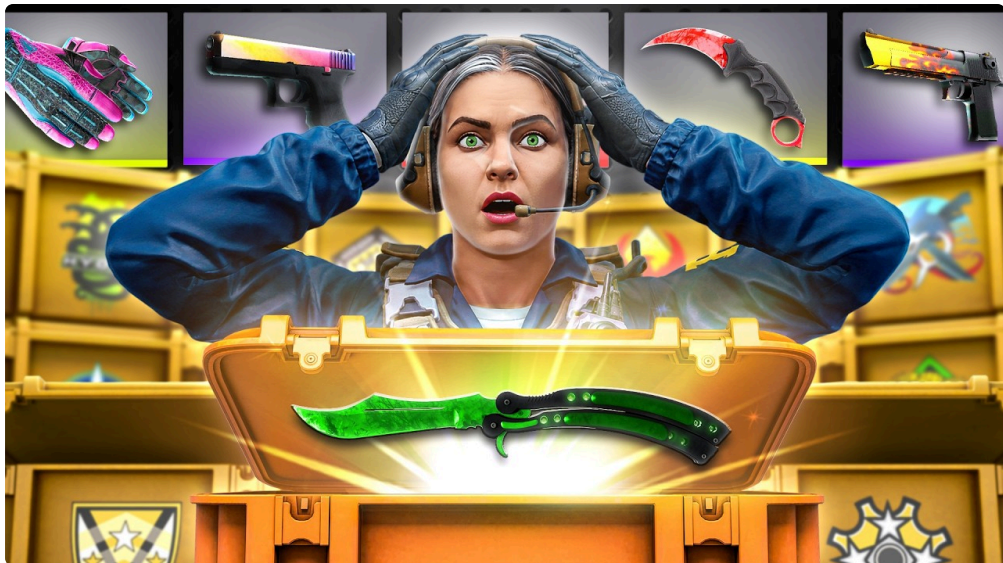
- **Steam Marketplace:** The primary place for purchasing cases outright. Prices are set by sellers; market charges apply.
- **Third-Party Trading Sites:** Platforms such as CSGOSkins.gg, Skinbay, or Buff.163 often list cases at somewhat lower commissions, however verify seller reputation.
- **Neighborhood Giveaways & Events:** Occasionally, Valve or community influencers host free gifts where older cases are granted. Taking part in official CS: GO tournaments can likewise yield tradition case drops.
- **Package Purchase:** Some collectors purchase "mystery boxes" that might consist of older cases; however, this technique is risky and frequently not cost-effective.

Tips for New Collectors

- **Research study Before Buying:** Verify the case's credibility (some counterfeit listings exist). Utilize the Steam Community Market's "listings history" to gauge rate patterns.
- **Store Cases Properly:** In-game stock is limited; consider utilizing Steam's "Inventory" filters to keep rare cases arranged.
