4. Prize/ Pot Games

- **How it works:** Multiple gamers deposit skins into a collective pot. Each skin contributes tickets based upon its dollar value. A random draw selects a winner, where a higher overall contribution yields a greater analytical chance of winning the whole pot.
- **Appeal:** The supreme "high-roller" video game mode, where single lucky winners can win countless dollars in rare digital items.
