



What Is Included in Garage Door Repair?

Garage door repair can include anything from a small adjustment to replacing a major operating component. A technician may check the entire **overhead garage door**, identify the source of the problem, and explain whether repair, adjustment, or replacement is the best option.

Frequently needed repair work includes:

- Replacing a damaged **garage door panel** or reinforcing a weakened section.
