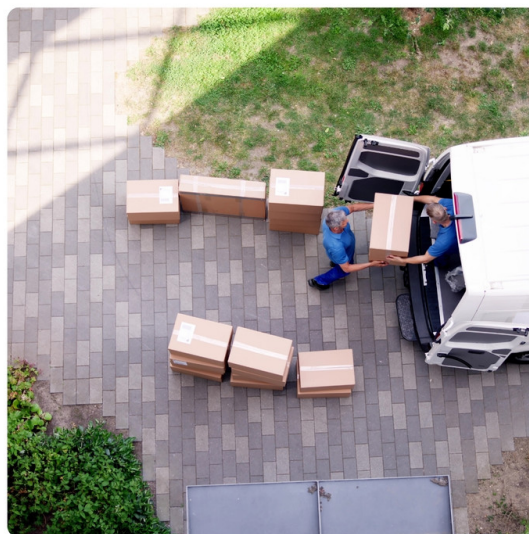
Why the Cheapest Estimate May Not Be the Best Choice
