

How Much Does a 2-Car Garage Door Replacement Cost?

The usual **2 car garage door replacement cost** near Los Angeles often comes between **\$1,200 and \$4,500** for the door and regular installation. A simple, non-insulated steel **overhead garage door** may be near the less expensive end, while an insulated, custom, designer, or wood door can cost substantially more.

Labor cost differs according to the difficulty of the replacement, the contractor's experience, scheduling, and local travel. A straightforward installation in a prepared opening usually costs less than a project requiring framing repairs, upgraded tracks, new springs, or substantial removal work.
