

A garage door is one of the largest moving systems in a Los Angeles home, and a failure can threaten security, convenience, and entry to your vehicle. Whether your automatic garage door produces strange sounds, the door fails to open, or a broken spring leaves it stuck, the right repair depends on the underlying problem, the door's age, and the condition of its main components.

A broken garage door spring is among the most common reasons a door becomes unusually heavy or stops halfway. Springs counterbalance the weight of the door, so operating the system without a properly functioning spring can overload the opener and create a safety hazard. A damaged garage door panel, bent track, worn roller, or loose hinge can also cause poor garage door alignment.

Why Won't My Garage Door Open or Close?

If the door won't open, first check whether the opener has power and whether the remote control works. Replace the remote battery if necessary, then try the wall switch. If the wall switch operates the door but the remote does not, the issue may involve the remote, its programming, or the opener's receiver.

When the door won't close, inspect the photo-eye sensors near the floor on both sides of the garage door. These safety sensors must face each other and remain clear of dirt, storage items, or cobwebs. Misaligned safety sensors often cause the door to reverse or refuse to close. Wipe the lenses gently and check whether the indicator lights are steady, but do not bypass the sensors.

Examine the garage door track for an obstruction, dent, or loose fastener. A track that is bent or out of alignment can prevent smooth movement and may cause the opener to stop for safety reasons. If the door moves only a few inches, disconnect the opener using the manual release only if the door is fully closed and stable. A door that is heavy, tilted, or partly open should be left alone until it is inspected.

A noisy garage door may have worn garage door rollers, dry hinges, loose bolts, or a damaged track. Squeaking, grinding, popping, and rattling sounds can provide clues, but sound alone does not identify the failed part. A misaligned door often signals a damaged or stretched lift cable, inconsistent spring tension, worn rollers, or an obstruction in the track.
