3. Live roulette

Comparable to traditional casino live roulette, however normally adapted with three results (red, black, and green/multiplier) represented by CS2 skin colors or team logo designs.

4. Coinflip

An easy 1v1 video game where two players wager skins or credits of roughly equivalent value. The system flips a virtual coin, and the winner takes the whole pot (minus a little website commission, referred to as [CS2 Gambling Sites](#) the "rake").

5. Jackpot

Several players deposit skins into a main pool. A virtual timer counts down, and a winner is picked through a lottery system. The higher the value of the skins a gamer deposits, the higher their statistical chance of winning the whole pot.
