1. The AWP|Dragon Lore

Maybe the most popular skin in the game, the Dragon Lore features a legendary dragon breathing fire across the body of the sniper rifle. Originally dropped exclusively on particular maps like Cobblestone throughout significant tournaments, these memento packages are now exceptionally unusual. A Factory New Souvenir Dragon Lore signed by super star player Skaddoodle notoriously offered for over £ 60,000 years ago, and rates have only escalated given that.

2. The AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 "Blue Gem")

While a basic Case Hardened AK-47 is reasonably inexpensive, the top-tier pattern indices-- specifically Pattern 661-- cover practically the whole leading receiver of the gun in a pristine, reflective blue. Because the chances of unpacking this specific pattern with an excellent float value are astronomically low, these products have commanded private offers exceeding 6 figures.

3. StatTrak™ M4A4|Shout

The Howl is special since it holds historical significance. Valve got rid of the original artwork due to a copyright violation claim, making the skin "Contraband." Valve upgraded the design and stopped it from dropping entirely. Anybody holding a Howl at that time kept it, developing a completely capped supply.
