

Hauppauge does not advertise itself loudly, and that is part of its appeal. It sits in the middle of Suffolk County with the kind of practical, working-town character that rewards people who pay attention. You notice it in the corporate parks along Veterans Memorial Highway, in the older neighborhoods where shade trees spread over driveways, and in the way the area can look bright one week and dulled by pollen, road film, and weather the next.
