

When a car key snaps, a fob stops responding, or the ignition refuses to turn, the problem usually feels bigger than the inconvenience itself. What the Orlando market asks a locksmith to cover

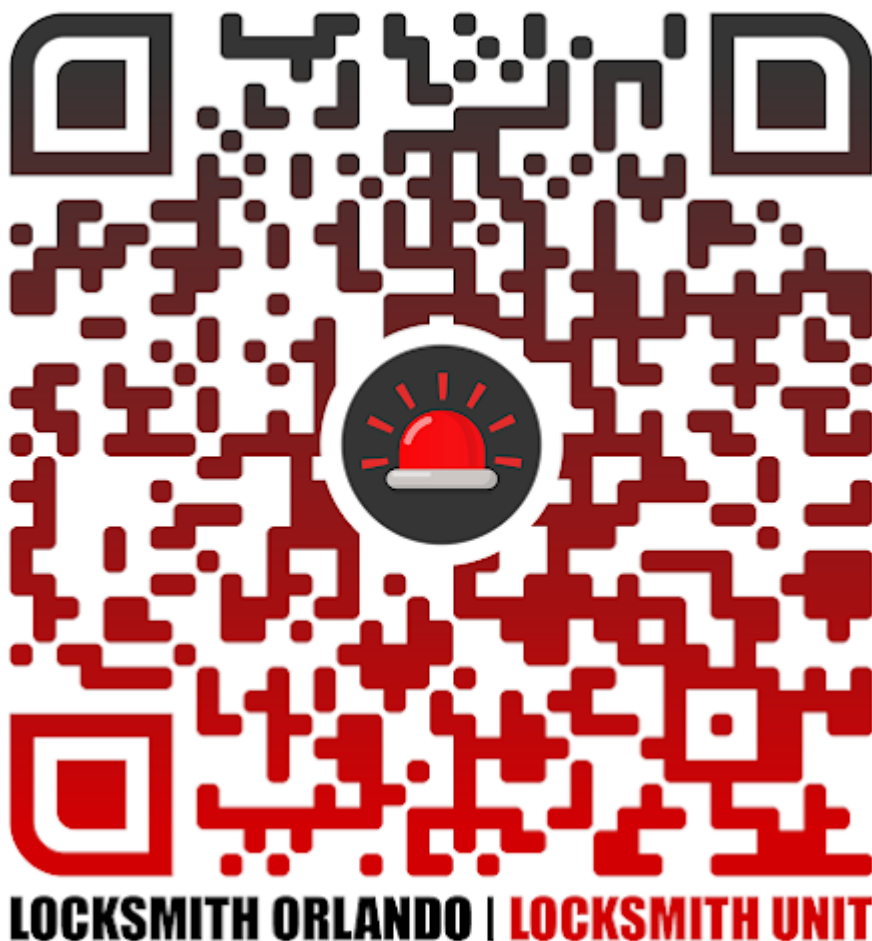
