For instance, the *Kilowattec Case* (2023) initially cost £ 0.70 but rapidly rose to £ 2.20 due to the addition of an extremely sought after "Karambit" skin. Alternatively, older cases like the *CS: GO Weapon Case 1* can cost hundreds of dollars due to the fact that they are no longer obtainable through drops.
