Field-Tested (FEET)	0.15-- 0.38	Obvious wear, scratches, and fading. This is the most typical condition.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Significant wear. Parts of the paint might look broke or heavily faded.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Severe wear. The weapon looks heavily rusted, beaten, or nearly removed of paint.

Note: Some skins are "capped," meaning they can not drop in Factory New condition, while others really look better with greater wear (referred to as "Blackimovs" on particular AWP models).



2. Rarity Tiers and Drop Rates

Skins are color-coded based upon their rarity. This rarity dictates how tough the product is to obtain through random drops or by opening weapon cases with keys.

- **Customer Grade (White):** Common, basic drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly much better than Consumer Grade.
- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** Standard quality for many collection drops and low-tier case products.
- **Restricted (Purple):** Uncommon; frequently used as trade-up fodder.

- **Categorized (Pink):** Rare, highly desired weapon surfaces.
- **Covert (Red):** The highest basic rarity discovered in cases, including iconic designs like the AWP|Asiimov or M4A4|Growl.
- **Exceedingly Rare (★ Gold):** Special products, consisting of Knives and Gloves.

Approximate Case Odds

Opening cases is a kind of gambling, and the chances greatly prefer your house. According to community research study and Valve's main disclosures in specific regions, the rough likelihoods of unboxing items are:

- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** ~ 79.92%
- **Restricted (Purple):** ~ 15.98%

- **Special Item (★ Gold/Knife/Gloves):** ~ 0.26%

3. **Pattern Templates:** Certain skins make use of a randomized pattern index (0 to 999).
 - *Case Hardened* skins, for example, can have a massive amount of "blue gem" protection, driving their costs into 10s of countless dollars.
 - *Fade* portions determine just how much of the rainbow gradient is noticeable on the weapon.
4. **Sticker labels and Souvenirs:** Applying expert competition sticker labels can in some cases add value, specifically if they are uncommon autographs or from terminated Major champions.
