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Every tree tells a story, but stumps tend to inform the wrong one. Ask the estimator which maker they prepare to bring and why. If you have a Norway maple that was 32 inches at breast height, the stump will be a chore for a compact system. It can be done, but the team must allocate time, cost, and clean-up appropriately. Timing around weather and soil
