What About Bundling?

On grok.com, SuperGrok Lite for \$10/month is sold as a standalone product, not just a component of an artificial bundle. This is important: **it is NOT just a sub-plan of a larger suite** that requires separate purchases or hidden commitments.

The \$0 Free Tier: Demo or Trial, Not a Paid Plan

What's Locked Behind Paywalls or Higher Plans?

- **Advanced Analytics and Reporting:** Only in SuperGrok Heavy or enterprise.
- **Custom Model Training:** Not available in Lite; requires Heavy.
- **Higher Rate Limits:** Heavier API usage and team seats;
- **Dedicated Onboarding and SLA Support:** Enterprise-level feature.

The key takeaway is that the Lite plan's \$10/mo fee covers a solid amount of usage, but not a high volume or the really deep customization features that some larger teams demand.

Rate Limits: The Silent Usage Locks You Need to Know

Rate limits are one of those things SaaS pricing pages love to dodge. Last month, I was working with a client who wished they had known this beforehand.. SuperGrok Lite's published rate limits are "moderate," but what does that mean in practice?

When you're a team of five running frequent searches through a knowledge base or integration like Slack, you don't want hidden pauses or errors. Here's our approximate estimation based on available docs and user reports:

- ~100 queries per user per day, spread fairly evenly
- Document uploads limited to roughly 100 per user monthly
- API calls throttled to a few per second

Here's what kills me: any spike above these limits risks temporary locking or escalating costs when upgrading beyond lite. How SuperGrok Compares to DeepSearch and Big Brain
