dumpster rental—the document or webpage listing the costs for each dumpster size, rental period, and additional services.

Typical dumpster rental charges include:

- **Base Rental Fee:** Covers delivery, pickup, and a specified rental period (often 7 to 10 days).
- **Weight Limit or Material Limit:** Each dumpster size has a weight or volume limit included in the base price.

If you’re having a dumpster placed on your driveway, a hidden source of potential damage—sometimes followed by repair fees—can be the dumpster itself. Heavy roll-off dumpsters with large wheels or metal skids can leave dents, scratches, or even cracks in asphalt or concrete driveways.

Reputable local dumpster companies in Hampton Roads take proactive steps to protect your property. One of the most effective ways to do that is by laying down **hardwood boards** under the dumpster’s wheels and rails before placement. Here’s why:

- **Distributes Weight Evenly:** Hardwood boards spread the dumpster’s load, reducing pressure points on the driveway.
- **Protects Surface Coatings:** Boards prevent skids and wheels from scraping off sealcoats or causing chips.
- **Prevents Long-Term Damage:** Less wear-and-tear means lower chances of cracks or potholes forming under or around the dumpster.

Dumpster sizes typically range from 10 to 40 cubic yards, with the most popular residential sizes being 10, 15, 20, and 30 yards. However, choosing the right dumpster isn't just about volume—it's about the nature of your materials and your project scope.

Dumpster Size (Cubic Yards)	Typical Usage	Approximate Dimensions (L x W x H in feet)
10	Small cleanouts or minor renovations	10' x 8' x 4'
15	Medium remodels or roof tear-offs	15' x 8' x 4'
20	Whole-house cleanouts or moderate builds	20' x 8' x 4'
30	Large remodels or multi-room demolition	22' x 8' x 6'
40	Major construction debris or roofing projects	22' x 8' x 8'

Reading a dumpster fee schedule without considering realistic project needs is a recipe for overpaying or needing extensions and overage fees. For example, if your roof tear-off produces a large volume of heavy shingles, selecting a dumpster that's too small will likely mean exceeding the included weight limits and triggering *overage fees*. Conversely, renting an unnecessarily large dumpster might bump up your base rental fee without added value.
