The Five Wear Categories

To assist gamers understand the physical condition of a weapon at a look, Valve classified float worths into five distinct tiers:

Condition Name	Float Value Range	Visual Description
Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Beautiful condition with little to no visible scratches or use.
Very Little Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Very minor imperfections, generally only visible upon close assessment.
Field-Tested (FEET)	0.15-- 0.38	Visible wear, scratches, and slight paint breaking on high-friction areas.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Considerable wear, fading colors, and popular scratches.

Battle-Scarred (BS) 0.45-- 1.00 Heavily distressed, rusted, or scraped away, often providing the weapon a gritty, industrial appearance.

The CS2 Economy: Rarity Tiers

Skins are classified into different rarity tiers, which dictate their drop rates in-game or acquisition rates by means of weapon cases. Understanding these tiers is necessary for anybody aiming to understand the marketplace worth of their stock.

- **Customer Grade (White):** Common, fundamental weapon surfaces, usually discovered in weekly gameplay drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly less common than customer grade, however still typically low-value.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** The standard baseline for most collection and case skins.
- **Restricted (Purple):** Often forms the middle tier of case drops; visually striking and reasonably priced.
- **Classified (Pink):** High-tier weapons that include intricate art work and command considerable market attention.
- **Covert (Red):** The greatest standard weapon tier, featuring the most popular rifle and SMG surfaces in the game.
- **Special Item (Gold/Exotic):** The rarest tier, encompassing knives and representative gloves.

How to Acquire CS2 Skins

Players have several opportunities to acquire and broaden their digital toolboxes, varying from casual gameplay to active market trading.

- **Weekly Care Packages:** By playing on main servers and leveling up as soon as a week, players receive a care plan permitting them to select a few free graffiti or weapon drops.
- **Opening Cases:** Players can purchase or make weapon cases and utilize a corresponding key (bought from the in-game store) to open a random skin. *Note: This works likewise to a lottery game system and relies greatly on chance.*
- **The Steam Community Market:** The official, controlled community where players buy and offer skins utilizing Steam Wallet funds.
- **Third-Party Trading Platforms:** Independent markets allow users to purchase and offer skins for real-world fiat currency or cryptocurrency, often featuring lower charges and more robust trading tools.

Tips for Trading and Collecting Safely

Since high-tier CS2 skins can command rates equivalent to high-end cars or real estate, the community is unfortunately targeted by destructive actors, scammers, and phishers. Anybody [cs2skin](#) taking part in the skin economy must follow rigorous safety procedures:

- **Enable Steam Guard:** Always use the Steam Guard Mobile Authenticator to secure your account versus unauthorized logins and trades.
