

Heavy furniture moving through a home puts real strain on hardwood floors, door frames, and walls, and even a careful crew can cause damage without the right equipment. **DMV Movers** use a set of standard protective measures on every job to keep these surfaces free of scratches, dents, and scuffs.

Protecting Hardwood and Tile Floors

Floor runners made of thick, non-slip material create a protected path across hardwood, tile, or carpeted floors during loading and unloading. A DMV Moving Company lays these runners along the primary path furniture will travel, from each room to the front door, before any large items are moved.

Furniture sliders placed under heavy items like dressers and bookshelves allow the crew to move pieces without dragging them across the floor, which prevents scratches that dragging alone would cause even with runners in place.

Shielding Door Frames and Corners

Movers in DMV apply corner guards to door frames and stair railings in high-traffic areas, cushioning any accidental contact during tight turns.

Protective Equipment as Standard Practice

For moves involving fragile wall-mounted items like televisions or shelving, the [packing services](#) team also removes and packs these items separately to avoid contact damage during furniture transport.



Protecting Walls During Tight Turns

Moving blankets wrapped around large furniture pieces prevent contact damage to walls when navigating **DMV movers** hallways and stairwells with limited clearance. A DMV Moving Company trained in tight-space moves also measures doorways in advance, planning the safest angle to move each large item through without excessive contact with nearby walls.

- Lay floor runners along the primary furniture path
- Use furniture sliders to prevent dragging on hardwood or tile
- Apply corner guards to door frames and stair railings
- Wrap large furniture in moving blankets for tight turns
