What is Crazy Time?

At its core, Crazy Time is a live dealer game show built around an enormous, vertically installed 52-segment wheel. Hosted by charismatic speakers in a vibrant, carnival-themed studio, the game is relayed in high-definition with augmented truth elements flawlessly woven into the gameplay.

The primary objective is simple: gamers put bets on which segment the wheel will stop on. However, the addition of a Top Slot multiplier in every round-- along with 4 hugely different bonus games-- elevates it far beyond a standard wheel-of-fortune game.

Understanding the Wheel Segments

The 52-segment wheel is divided into numbers and benefit video games. The numbers pay even cash or much better, while the reward symbols give gamers entry into the video game's heading acts.

Here is how the wheel is dispersed:

- **Number 1:** 21 segments (Pays 1:1)
- **Number 2:** 13 segments (Pays 2:1)
- **Number 5:** 7 sections (Pays 5:1)
- **Number 10:** 4 sections (Pays 10:1)
- **Coin Flip:** 4 sectors
- **Pachinko:** 2 sectors

- **Money Hunt:** 2 sections
- **Crazy Time:** 1 section

The Top Slot Feature

Before every spin of the primary wheel, a two-reel mini [View website](#) fruit machine situated straight above the wheel spins simultaneously.

- **Reel 1** display screens a bet spot (either a number or a perk video game).
- **Reel 2** display screens a multiplier (ranging from 2x up to 50x).

If the bet area and the multiplier align horizontally, that multiplier is used to the matching section on the main wheel for that round. If the wheel arrive at that sector, all wins for that bet are multiplied accordingly, setting the phase for huge payments.

Dive Into the Four Bonus Rounds

The real magic-- and volatility-- of Crazy Time lies in its 4 interactive bonus rounds. These video games transport players out of the studio through CGI and use the game's biggest win potential.

1. Coin Flip

The simplest of the bonus rounds, Coin Flip features a red-and-blue token flipped by a machine.

- **How it works:** Before the flip, both sides of the coin are appointed random multipliers.
- **The Outcome:** Whichever color lands face up awards the player the multiplier connected to that side.

2. Pachinko

Influenced by the standard Japanese arcade video game, Pachinko includes a large physical wall filled with pegs.

- **How it works:** The host drops a puck from the top of the board. It bounces arbitrarily down through the pegs until it lands in among several multiplier slots at the bottom.
- **The "Double" Feature:** If the puck lands in a "DOUBLE" slot, all multipliers at the bottom of the board double, and the puck is dropped again for a possibility at even bigger rewards.

3. Money Hunt

Money Hunt is an interactive shooting gallery video game provided on a massive screen with 108 random multipliers concealed behind numerous signs (like a cactus, a target, or a chef's hat).

- **How it works:** Players use an on-screen cannon to aim and shoot at a sign of their choice before the countdown timer ends. When the timer ends, all gamers expose the multiplier concealed behind their chosen target. (Note: In automated play, the game picks a target for the gamer).

4. Crazy Time

The supreme bonus offer round and the hardest to activate. The host opens a red door, leading gamers into a surreal, brightly colored virtual world featuring an enormous, 64-segment wheel.

- **How it works:** Players need to pick one of 3 flappers (Green, Blue, or Yellow). The host spins the wheel, and whichever multiplier the selected flapper indicate when the wheel stops is awarded to the gamer.

- **The "Double" and "Triple" sections:** Just like Pachinko, if the wheel stops on a "DOUBLE" or "TRIPLE" section, all multipliers on the wheel increase accordingly, and the wheel is spun once again. This is where the maximum 20,000 x multiplier can be accomplished.

Benefits and drawbacks of Playing Crazy Time

Like all gambling establishment games, Crazy Time features its own special set of advantages and possible drawbacks.

Pros:

- **Unmatched Entertainment Value:** High-energy hosts, brilliant visuals, and game-show styling make it incredibly enjoyable to enjoy and play.
- **Huge Win Potential:** With the help of the Top Slot and perk round multipliers, wins can rise to 20,000 x the stake.
- **Interactive Elements:** Games like Cash Hunt and Crazy Time require (or simulate) player involvement, adding a layer of engagement not discovered in standard slots.
- **Social Atmosphere:** The integrated live chat enables gamers from all over the world to commemorate wins together.

Cons:

- **High Volatility:** Because a large portion of the wheel's payout capacity is tied to bonus offer rounds, droughts can rapidly drain pipes a bankroll.
- **Lower RTP on Bonuses:** While basic number bets have a reasonably good Return to Player, betting solely on benefit rounds generally carries a lower theoretical RTP.
- **Hectic:** Rounds happen quickly, which can lead to overspending if players do not manage their bankrolls carefully.

Basic Strategies for Crazy Time

While Crazy Time is a game of pure chance dictated by a random number generator (RNG) and physical wheel physics, players frequently employ wagering methods to handle risk and extend their playtime.

- **The Cover-All Strategy:** Betting on all or many of the segments (numbers and benefit video games) ensures you rarely miss out on a spin, though the cost of covering the board can outweigh the smaller sized payments.
- **Benefit Chasing:** Focusing solely on the benefit rounds (Coin Flip, Pachinko, Cash Hunt, and Crazy Time). This is a high-risk, high-reward strategy considering that reward rounds take place on only 9 of the 52 sectors.
- **Analytical Betting:** Relying on the video game's history tracker. Some players like to bank on sectors that haven't hit in a very long time (the "hot/cold" fallacy), though previous spins statistically have no bearing on future results.

Crazy Time has truly earned its reputation as a leader in live dealer home entertainment. By combining the nostalgic appeal of a tv game reveal with modern-day digital graphics and enormous payment potential, Evolution Gaming has created an experience that attract both casual gamers and high-stakes gamblers alike.
