- **Jackpot:** Multiple players deposit skins into a communal pot. A winner is drawn randomly, with higher-value deposits increasing a player's analytical chance of winning the entire pot.

Comparing CS2 Gambling vs. Traditional Online Casinos

While both include wagering, CS2 gambling differs substantially from standard online gambling in terms of currency, availability, and neighborhood integration.
