Common Strategies Used in Crash Gambling

- **The Auto-Cashout Strategy:** Players set a conservative multiplier (e.g., 1.2 x or 1.3 x) and depend on constant, incremental gains. While efficient in the short term, a single instant-crash (1.00 x) can clean out many little wins.
- **The Martingale System:** A classic betting technique where a gamer doubles their bet after every loss, aiming to recuperate all previous losses plus a revenue when they lastly win. This requires an enormous bankroll and typically hits platform wagering limits.
- **The High-Risk Sniper:** Waiting for a long streak of low crashes (e.g., several rounds ending under 1.5 x) under the incorrect presumption that a "high multiplier is due."

The Illusion of Control and the Gambler's Fallacy
