

Chandler does not announce itself with the kind of drama people expect from a fast-growing desert city. It is not trying to be a mirage of Old West nostalgia, and it is not pretending to be a sleepy suburb either. The city has spent decades becoming something more practical and more interesting than either stereotype.
