

Garage door issues can influence security, convenience, and entry to your home. A door that is noisy, jammed, or visibly damaged may need anything from a simple adjustment to a complete replacement. 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If the garage door won't close, inspect the photo-eye sensors near the floor on both sides of the opening. They must face each other and remain clean and unobstructed. Dust, misalignment, sunlight, or damaged wiring can cause the opener to reverse. Never bypass the sensors because they are an important part of garage door safety.

Look at the garage door tracks for dents, gaps, loose fasteners, or obstructions. A door off track can jam or fall, creating a serious hazard. Do not force the door or attempt to realign heavy sections without proper tools and experience. A technician should inspect the rollers, cables, springs, and track alignment together.

When Does a Broken Garage Door Spring Need Immediate Service?

A broken garage door spring needs prompt service because the spring supports much of the door's weight. A torsion spring is mounted above the door, while an extension spring is usually positioned along the horizontal

tracks. Either type can break after years of repeated cycles.

Warning signs of a broken spring can include a sudden snap, a clear gap in the spring, a door that feels abnormally heavy, or a door that lifts only a few inches. You may also see loose cables or a door that hangs at an angle. Do not take off spring hardware, handle cables, or attempt garage door spring replacement without professional help. The existing tension can cause serious injury.

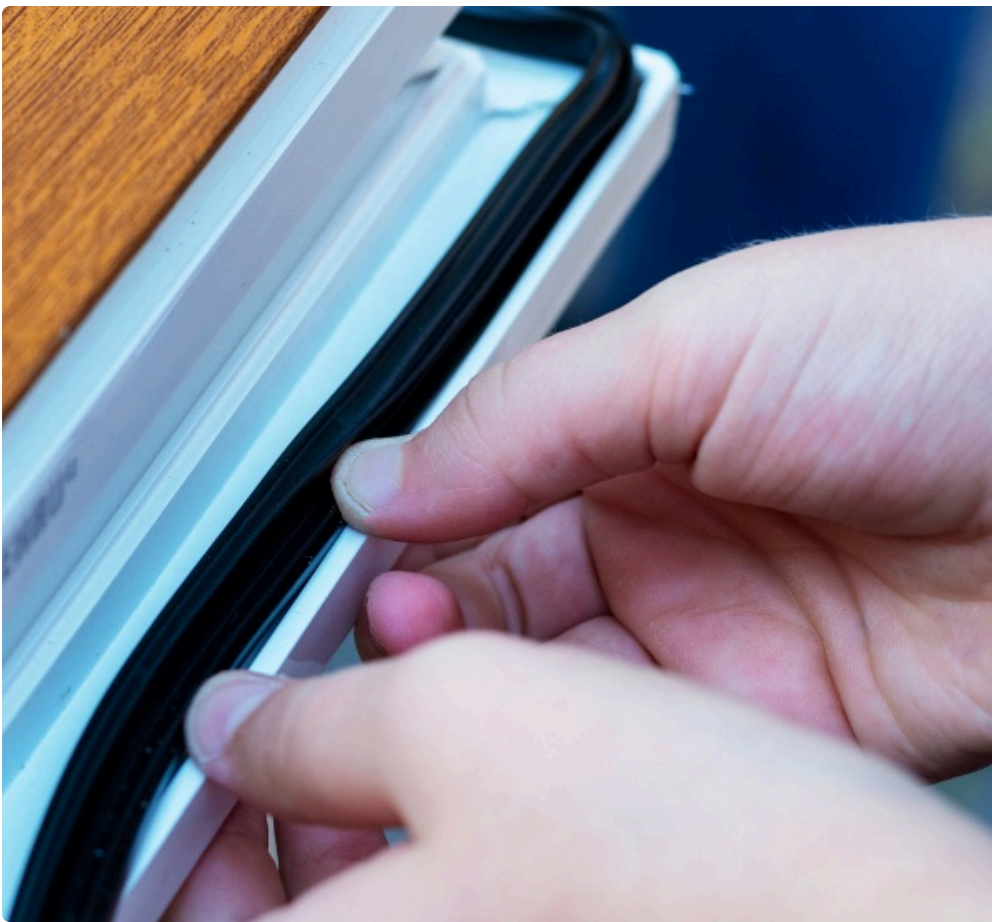

Do not try to adjust or replace a torsion spring, extension spring, lift cable, bottom bracket, or track under tension. Do not drill into spring mounts or remove brackets to make a door operate. These parts can move with considerable force. A safety inspection by a trained technician is the proper choice for a broken spring, damaged cable, door off track, or a door that feels unusually heavy.

Preventive maintenance can include periodic professional lubrication, balance testing, fastener checks, roller inspection, and weather seal replacement. Maintenance does not prevent normal wear, but it can spot problems before they become an emergency and may prolong the working life of the system.
