Many players wonder what their actual chances are of pulling a rare item. Valve does not officially publish the precise percentages for each single item, but through countless community-tracked case openings, the analytical probabilities have ended up being extensively accepted.

#### Estimated CS2 Case Drop Probabilities

- **Blue (Mil-Spec):** ~ 79.92%
- **Purple (Restricted):** ~ 15.98%
- **Pink (Classified):** ~ 3.20%
- **Red (Covert):** ~ 0.64%
- **Special Rare (Knives/ Gloves):** ~ 0.26%

*Note: Within each tier, there is an extra 10% possibility to get a **StatTrak**™ version, which tracks the variety of kills made with that weapon.*
