Avoid dumping your whole spending plan into a single high-tier case like *Operation Bravo* or *Recoil*. Instead, mix low-tier, stable-return cases with a few high-variance cases to stabilize the danger.

4. Use "Crazy Mode" Cautiously

Crazy Mode (where the most affordable overall worth wins) turns basic logic on its head. While it can be fun, it relies totally on hitting cheap, low-tier drops. Do not approach this mode with basic case-opening reasoning.
