

If you are dealing with rats in a Mississauga home, the quickest path is usually a mix of inspection, setting traps, blocking access, and sanitation. - Close foundation cracks and utility gaps
- Replace screens, vents, and door sweeps
- Store food sources tightly stored
- Increase sanitation in kitchens, garages, and basements
- Take away clutter and unused nesting materials
- Inspect the attic and crawl space periodically
