- **Jackpot:** Multiple gamers toss skins into a common pot. A timer counts down, and a random skin is selected; the higher a gamer's total contribution, the greater their statistical possibility of winning the entire pool.

- **Stop and Desist Letters:** Major platforms have actually periodically gotten legal cautions from the video game designer, requiring abrupt closures or pivots.
