Balancing Transparency with Privacy

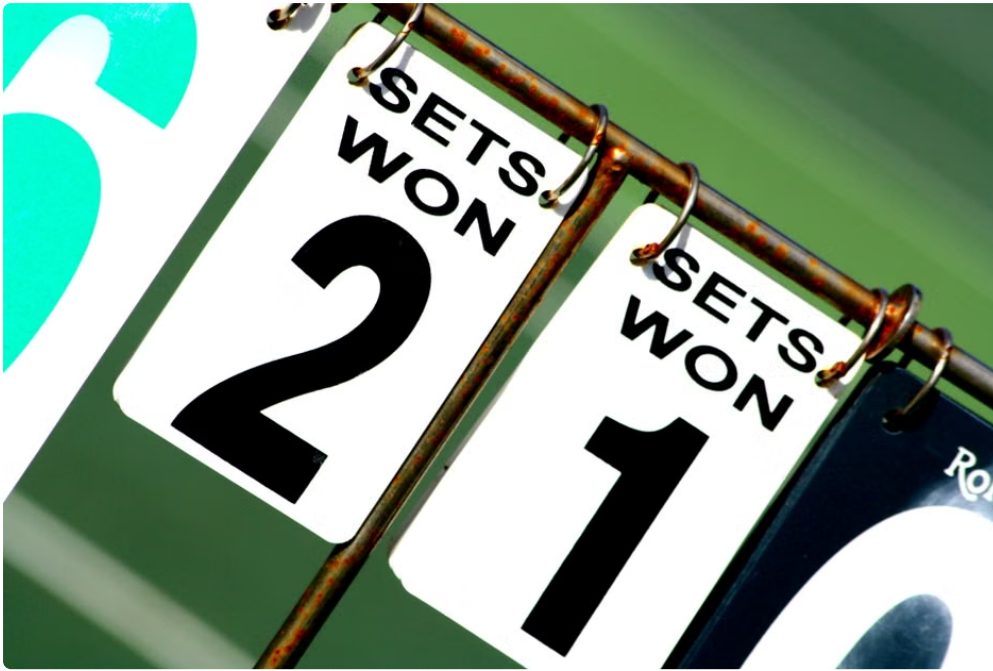
