### The Mechanics: How Transactions Work

- **Underage Gambling:** Because registration typically only requires a Steam account linked through OpenID, minors can sometimes bypass age verification checks, exposing young players to possible gambling addiction.
- **Scam Sites:** Fake or fraudulent clone sites frequently turn up, mimicking popular platforms solely to take user stocks via misleading Steam API phishing links.

## Best Practices for Navigating the Space

- **Never Log into Unfamiliar Links:** Phishing is widespread. Always double-check URLs before signing in through Steam OpenID.
