- **The Martingale System:** A classic betting technique where a gamer doubles their bet after every loss. The theory is that a single win will recover all previous losses plus an earnings equal to the original base bet. However, this requires an enormous bankroll and can rapidly strike site wagering limits.
- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, trying to ride a winning streak while keeping losses reduced to the base bet amount.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing small bets with the objective of holding out for enormous multipliers (50x, 100x, or greater). This operates similar to playing the lottery.

Advantages and disadvantages of CS: GO Crash
