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Renting the wrong storage unit usually exposes itself in one of two undesirable ways. You either pay month after month for empty air, or you invest moving day playing a sweaty, aggravating video game of real-life Tetris, convinced that one more lamp, another tote, one more dining chair must in some way fit. The majority of people lean on rough guesses when selecting among storage units, which is where trouble starts.
