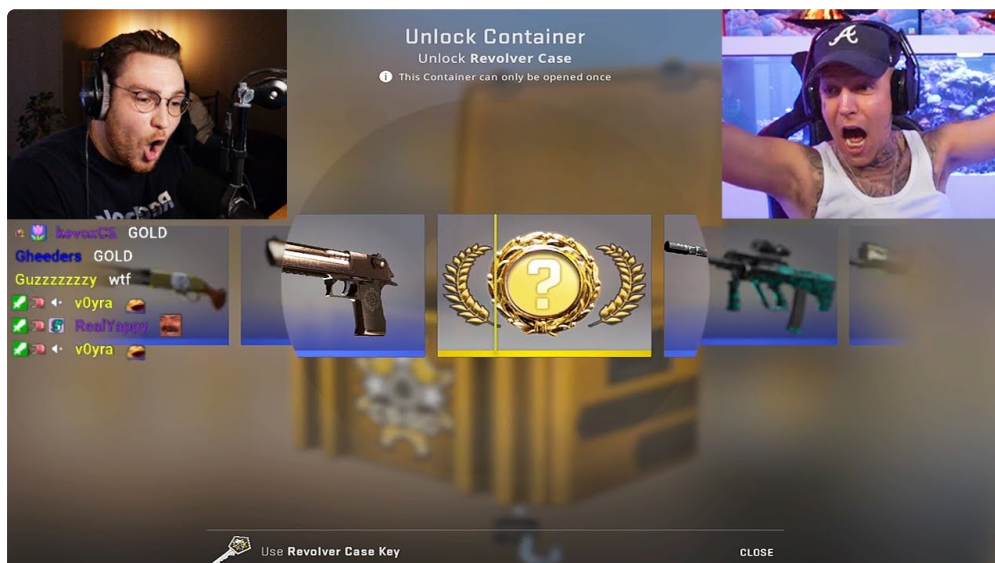

- **Beware of Scams:** Be mindful of individuals on social networks offering "totally free cash codes" or directing you to obscure platforms that need immediate skin deposits.
- **Understand Local Laws:** Ensure that taking part in skin-based betting complies with the legal policies of your jurisdiction.
