Case Opening	Replicates the in-game case opening experience, but often on third-party sites with custom-curated odds and higher-tier benefit pools. Exceptionally variable; normally favors your home greatly.	
Coinflip	An uncomplicated 1v1 PvP game where two players wager skins of roughly equivalent value. A virtual coin is flipped, and the winner takes the whole pot. 50/50 chances, minus a small platform commission (rake).	
Jackpot	Several players contribute skins to a main pot. Each skin's worth identifies the gamer's "ticket" share. A spinner chooses one winner who takes whatever. Based on the overall worth contributed; platform takes a portion charge.	

Functions of Modern CSGO Casinos
