The Rise of Airport Pick Up Charges in the UK

Many airports in the UK now levy charges on vehicles that stop briefly to collect passengers. These charges can vary from a modest fee to surprisingly expensive sums, depending on the airport. This trend has quietly spread over the past few years, impacting everyday travellers who might have assumed that being collected or dropped off at the airport is free or only minorly inconvenient.

Why have these fees increased? Airports use drop-off / pick-up fees to manage congestion and encourage alternative transport modes such as buses, trains, and park & ride services. While this intention helps with traffic flow and environmental aims, it does mean that passengers and their drivers face new costs.





Average Drop-Off Fees and Most Expensive Airports

Our latest research shows that the average UK airport drop-off charge is around **£6.51**. This may not sound like much for a single trip, but when combined with other travel expenses and repeat journeys, the costs add up quickly.

As the table shows, London Heathrow remains the most expensive for airport pick up charges, reflecting its high passenger numbers and congestion challenges. Many smaller regional airports charge less but still impose fees that travellers and their drivers may not be prepared for.

How Collection Rules at Airports Affect Your Costs

“Collection rules airport” policies vary, but in most cases, drivers are expected to pay for stopping at “Kiss & Fly” or short stay zones designed for rapid drop-offs and pickups. These zones openly charge a fee for vehicles stopping in designated lanes for a brief time. If drivers exceed the free grace period (often just a few minutes), they face fines or increased fees.

Moreover, short stay waiting rates come into play when a driver wants to wait and assist passengers with luggage or last-minute goodbyes. Airports implement these rates to discourage long waiting times that cause congestion. Sometimes it costs more to wait for just 10–15 minutes than to pay a normal short stay parking fee elsewhere.

Free or Cheaper Alternatives to Paying Drop-Off Fees

Thankfully, there are alternatives to paying pick-up charges that can save you money, though they usually require a bit more planning and time.

1. Use Long Stay or Park & Ride Car Parks

- Most major airports offer free shuttle transfers between long stay or park & ride car parks and terminals.
- These car parks have no drop-off charges and offer much cheaper parking rates for longer stays compared to short stay options.
- Drivers can park their car for free or a low fee, then take a shuttle bus that regularly runs to the terminal entrance.

Many passengers who want to be collected or dropped off at the airport can save money by having their driver park at these designated areas and use the shuttle transfer systems instead of waiting in the drop-off lane.

2. Meet Passengers Inside the Terminal

Instead of stopping in the drop-off zone, drivers can wait outside and meet passengers once they've passed arrivals. This could be in a nearby café, long stay car park, or along designated waiting zones with free waiting time.

This requires more coordination and patience but avoids paying airport pick up charges entirely.

Time Trade-Off: Shuttle Convenience vs Kerbside Ease

The main hidden cost of avoiding drop-off charges is time spent. Park & Ride or long stay shuttles increase journey time by at least 10–15 minutes compared to kerbside pickup, plus the effort of managing luggage on shuttles. For light travellers or those with tight schedules, this can feel inconvenient.

But for budget-conscious travellers, spending an extra 20 minutes on a shuttle is often worth the several pounds saved from drop-off charges. Compare this to parking or taxi fees and you can find substantial savings by planning ahead.
