Significant wear, paint heavily faded or broke. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Badly damaged, often totally altering the appearance of the weapon.

*Keep in **CS2 Gambling Site** mind: Some skins are "capped," indicating they can not drop in Factory New condition, making lower-float variations exceedingly rare and pricey.*

Rarity Tiers and Finishes

Skins are categorized into different rarity tiers, which determine their drop rates in cases and general prestige.

- **Consumer Grade (White):** Common, fundamental drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly less common low-tier products.
