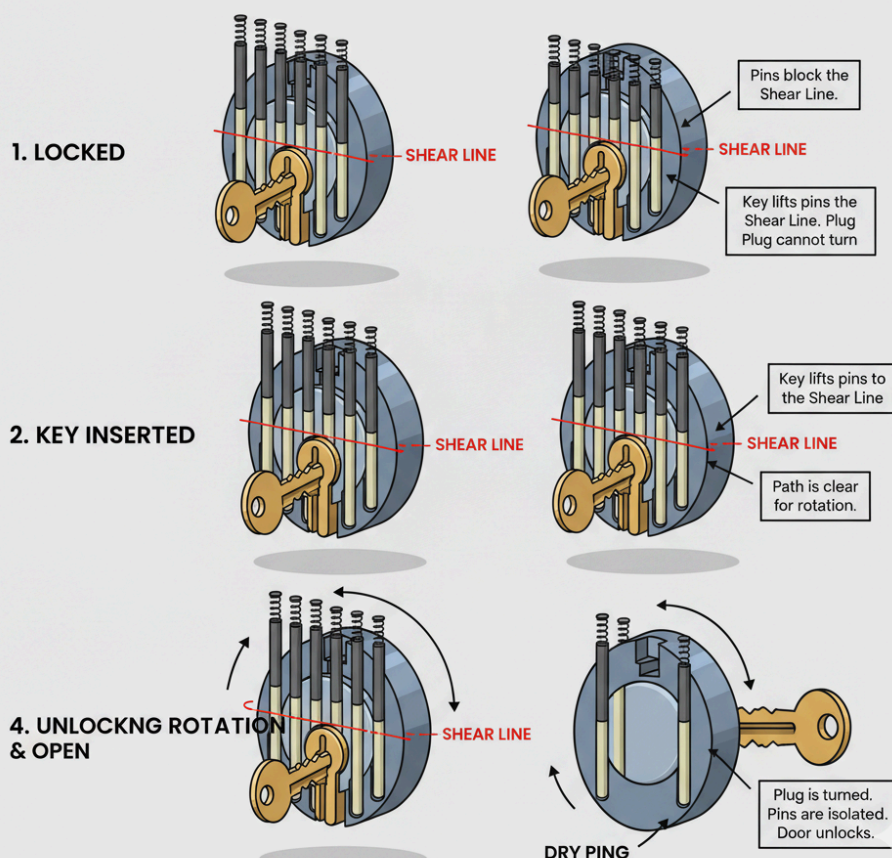
Why a mobile locksmith setup matters
