For smaller sized events, coordinators in some cases assume one individual restroom is enough since there are just a couple of lots visitors. That can operate in some cases, especially for brief gatherings with light food and no alcohol. But if the occasion lasts 4 to 6 hours, or the visitors are likely to stick around, a single unit can become a pinch point rapidly. At larger events, the opposite mistake happens. The event type changes the math
