- **StatTrak™ Technology:** An optional counter developed into the weapon that digitally tape-records the number of kills the owner achieves with it.
- **Memento Quality:** Items dropped specifically during main Valve-sponsored esports competitions (Majors), including gold stickers commemorating the match and groups.

The Wear Rating Hierarchy

Comprehending skin wear is crucial for anybody wanting to buy, offer, or trade. The wear condition is divided into 5 unique categories:



Exterior Condition Drift Value Range Visual Description **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful condition with minimal to no scratches or blemishes. **Minimal Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Very light wear, normally little scratches visible only upon close inspection. **Field-Tested (FEET)** 0.15-- 0.38 Obvious wear and tear, scratches on the body and paint breaking on edges. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Significant wear, heavy scratching, and obvious fading of colors. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Exceptionally worn, heavily faded, rusted, or scraped look.

Keep in mind: Some skins are "capped," meaning they can not physically drop in Factory New condition since of how the texture is programmed.
