

Holiday lighting without the annual setup

Permanent holiday lights are installed once and left up. That single sentence covers most of why people want them. What is up there is a slim LED track color matched to the house, which is why the house does not look decorated in July.

Not just the one week in December

Christmas is the reason most people call, though it ends up being one setting among many. And on the two hundred ordinary nights in between, it goes back to plain warm white, which is the setting that gets the most hours by a wide margin.

What the installation looks like

It starts with a free consultation. Somebody walks the property, talks through what you want, and draws a design for your house rather than a generic one. The install is done by the installers, not handed to you as a kit. After that, you have an app and a house that lights up.

Twelve months of appearance

The reasonable worry is a house that looks like it is waiting on December all year. The track gets matched to the color of your trim or fascia and sits tight to the roof line, which is why it does not read as decoration in daylight.

The fit

The people who get the most out of it are already decorating every December. It also works for people who should not be on a roof anymore, which is a bigger group than anybody admits. And it makes sense for anyone who wanted better light on the front of the property, holidays or not.

When to have the conversation

Everything happens ahead of the date you want it lit. That sounds obvious until you are three weeks out. Between the visit, the design and the install, there is a real sequence. The upside is that you only do this once. After the first install, [christmas light installation](#) December is a phone tap instead of a weekend. What surprises new owners is how rarely they open the app after a while. You set the holiday schedule once and it runs. Dusk to whatever hour you choose, automatically, every night of the season.

What is permanent outdoor lighting?

Permanent outdoor lighting is a fixed LED system installed along a building's roofline, eaves and architectural lines and left in place all year. The LEDs sit in a track that is color matched to the trim, and the system is controlled from a smartphone app. It replaces the seasonal strands that go up and come down each year.

Are the lights noticeable during the day?

The track is color matched to the trim or fascia and mounted tight along the edge of the roofline, so it is designed to stay discreet in daylight and read as part of the house rather than as decoration.

Does EverCrest Lighting install Christmas lights?

Yes. EverCrest Lighting installs Christmas and holiday lighting, and also installs permanent LED systems that handle holiday colors from an app. On traditional holiday lighting, EverCrest Lighting handles takedown at the end of the season and off season storage.
