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Every tree tells a story, but stumps tend to tell the wrong one. Ask the estimator which maker they prepare to bring and why. If you have a Norway maple that was 32 inches at breast height, the stump will be a task for a compact unit. It can be done, however the team needs to designate time, expense, and cleanup accordingly. In older communities like German Village, tight brick streets and fragile surface areas press the option towards compact tracked units, even if it indicates more passes.

Timing around weather condition and soil

Columbus swings from soggy spring to dry summer season, with freeze-thaw cycles that heave the ground. Grinding goes smoother when the soil is damp but not saturated. Too damp, and machines rut the lawn. Too dry, and dust control becomes an issue, specifically around homes with air intakes near grade. After heavy rain, offer the ground a day or two to tighten. Cleanup that really leaves you ahead
