3. Prime Status Benefits

4. Major Tournaments and View Passes

During Valve-sponsored CS2 Major champions, audiences can acquire or sometimes make Souvenir Packages.

- By watching the tournament live via the Steam TV or in-game client, or by taking part in the Pick 'Em Challenge utilizing a Viewer Pass, gamers can make Souvenir Cases particular to that tournament.
- These cases do not need an essential to open, making them 100% complimentary value once obtained.

Alternative Methods: External Sites (Proceed with Caution)

Many third-party sites promote "free CS: GO cases" through sign-up bonuses, promotion codes, or daily benefits. While a few of these platforms are genuine community-trusted trading or gambling sites, gamers need to work out severe care.
